

## **Driving to Belgrade from nearby European cities**

Belgrade, the capital of Serbia, is well connected by a network of highways and roads, making it easily accessible by car from many European cities. Below are some of the main driving routes to Belgrade:

### **From Vienna, Austria**

- Distance: ~600 km
- Estimated driving time: ~6 hours
- Route: Take the A4 highway from Vienna to Budapest, then follow the M5 highway to Szeged. Cross into Serbia at the Horgoš border crossing and continue on the E75 highway to Belgrade.

### **From Budapest, Hungary**

- Distance: ~380 km
- Estimated driving time: ~4 hours
- Route: Take the M5 highway from Budapest to Szeged. Cross the Horgoš border into Serbia and continue on the E75 highway to Belgrade.

### **From Debrecen, Hungary**

- Distance: ~320 km
- Estimated driving time: ~3.5 hours
- Route: Take the M35 highway from Debrecen to the M3 highway, then connect to the M5 highway toward Szeged. Cross into Serbia at the Horgoš border crossing and continue on the E75 highway to Belgrade.

### **From Zagreb, Croatia**

- Distance: ~400 km
- Estimated driving time: ~4 hours
- Route: Take the A3 highway from Zagreb to the Batrovci border crossing. After entering Serbia, continue on the E70 highway to Belgrade.

### **From Ljubljana, Slovenia**

- Distance: ~530 km
- Estimated driving time: ~5.5 hours
- Route: Take the A2 highway from Ljubljana to Zagreb, then follow the A3 highway to the Batrovci border crossing. Continue on the E70 highway to Belgrade.

### **From Brno, Czech Republic**

- Distance: ~650 km
- Estimated driving time: ~6.5 hours

- Route: Take the D2 highway from Brno to Bratislava, then continue on the M1 highway in Hungary. Follow the M5 highway to Szeged, cross into Serbia at the Horgoš border crossing, and continue on the E75 highway to Belgrade.

### **From Sofia, Bulgaria**

- Distance: ~400 km
- Estimated driving time: ~4 hours
- Route: Take the A6 highway from Sofia to the Gradina border crossing. After entering Serbia, follow the E80 highway to Niš, then take the E75 highway to Belgrade.

### **From Thessaloniki, Greece**

- Distance: ~630 km
- Estimated driving time: ~7 hours
- Route: Take the A1 highway from Thessaloniki to the Evzoni border crossing. Enter North Macedonia and follow the A1/E75 highway through Skopje to the Preševo border crossing. Continue on the E75 highway to Belgrade.

### **From Bucharest, Romania**

- Distance: ~600 km
- Estimated driving time: ~6.5 hours
- Route: Take the A1 highway from Bucharest to the Giurgiu border crossing. Enter Bulgaria and follow the E85 highway to Ruse, then take the E70 highway to the Kalotina border crossing into Serbia. Continue on the E75 highway to Belgrade.

## **Toll Roads and Border Crossings**

Serbia has a system of toll roads, so be prepared to pay tolls when using highways. The main border crossings into Serbia are **Horgoš (Hungary), Batrovci (Croatia), Gradina (Bulgaria), Preševo (North Macedonia) and Vatin (Romania)**.

## **Driving Tips**

- Serbia follows **right-hand driving**.
- Speed limits: **130 km/h on highways, 80 km/h on regional roads, and 50 km/h in urban areas**.
- Carry a valid **driver's license, vehicle registration...** When entering Serbia, it is not necessary to have a Green Card; a valid national insurance policy is sufficient.
- Modern fuel stations are available along the highways, most accepting credit cards.
